## **Purpose of This Public Forum**

- Arkansas Works operates as a section 1115 demonstration waiver
- Federal waiver regulations require an annual public forum to solicit comments on the progress of the demonstration
- Public has an opportunity to provide comments

Arkansas's Medicaid expansion program under the federal Affordable Care Act.

Serves adults:

- Between 19 and 64 years old
- With household income below 138% FPL

Federal government pays 90%; Arkansas pays 10% Uses Medicaid dollars to buy private insurance for clients



- Nearly 330,000 people are currently enrolled in Arkansas Works.
- About 19% of Arkansas's non-elderly adults receive health coverage through Arkansas Works.
- SFY 2021 expenditures totaled **\$2.46 billion**.

## **Arkansas Works Evaluation**

- Interim evaluation submitted in June 2021

- Evaluation assesses Arkansas Works clients':
  ✓ Continuity of care
  ✓ Access to health care
  ✓ Quality of Care
  ✓ Cost effectiveness of services
- Final evaluation June 2023



## **Arkansas Works Evaluation**

#### **Continuity of care**

- Shorter gaps in coverage
- Proportion of visits with same specialist higher for some specialties, but lower for visits with same PCP

#### Access to health care

- No meaningful difference in provider network adequacy or accessibility
- Increased insured rates, rates of having a personal doctor and rates of getting a routine check-up
- Higher rates of breast cancer screening and preventive care visit; lower rates of cervical cancer screening



## **Arkansas Works Evaluation**

#### **Quality of Care**

No difference in:

- Preventable ED visits
- Hospital admissions for diabetes complications, COPD, asthma
- Hospital readmissions

#### **Cost effectiveness of services**

- Premium costs increased over three-year evaluation period, but...
- Premiums increased at a lower rate than in surrounding states



## **Arkansas Works to ARHOME**

- Arkansas Works state law and federal waiver expire December 31, 2021
- Act 530 of 2021 authorizes DHS to apply for a new five-year waiver
- DHS applied for a new waiver in July
- New program will be known as the Arkansas Health and Opportunity for Me program, or ARHOME
- Currently awaiting CMS approval
