David 21 Whatley were actually charter members of this 22 Board. But even before that, James was a part 23 of the other Board that oversaw Child Welfare 24 Residential Placement and also Daycare at that 25 time.

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James, as I understand, was actively 2 involved with the legislature in creating the 3 original licensing board and, you know, he 4 often bragged that he was placed on this Board 5 by five different governors. And so James --James, even though we don't see much anymore of 6 7 James in the recent years his impact on child 8 welfare in Arkansas continues on through his 9 past days now. 10 Some of you know James, and I would like 11 to just take a minute if anyone would kind of 12 like to make a comment or share a story. For 13 me, I first met James --14 MR. SANFORD: I am having difficulty. Is 15 anybody talking? This is Sanford. 16 MR. FLYNN: What did you say, Sanford? MS. FATIMA: Sanford, this is Fatima. They have not started yet to my knowledge. 19 MR. TOLLETTE: Oh, I see Fatima. MR. FLYNN: Okay, Fatima? Fatima, can you hear me? MR. TOLLETTE: This is working. So, thank you for responding. For me, what I remember -- well, 24 so many things about James during the years, 25 the first time I met him was in 1992, almost 30

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years ago really. And it was at a -- a conference. And even then James was doing a skit called the World's Oldest Living Childcare Worker and -- but what I remember about them is the same thing I saw on James's 80th birthday, Louda and I went and saw James, and Charlene was bouncing around like always and James was pretty calm. But, the same thing I saw 30 years ago that I saw then was that genuine smile. Not just in his mouth, but a smile in his eyes, and the comfort and the joy that James brought to a room. But through and through the years of this

Board I remember memories like at one of our retreats climbing to the top of Mount Magazine with James and Charlene. So, lot's of good memories and thankful for the impact that he had not just at the Children's Home there at Paragould but throughout the State for our programs.

21 But I'd like also to -- if anyone else 22 would like to share your opinion of James or a 23 thought I'll give you a second to do that. 24 MR. WHATLEY: This is David Whatley, and 25 well said Charles. I'd just like to say that

9	of Arkansas for so many years in the really
10	the lifetime of service he gave. It was just,
11	you know, one of things that's just amazing to
12	see. And so I can truly say that it was just a
13	privilege and honor to know him and to be
14	associated with Mr. James Balcom.
15	MR. FLYNN: What I'd like to do then is
16	before going on with the meeting, I've asked
17	David Whatley if he would just voice a prayer.
18	MR. TOLLETTE: Charles?
19	MR. FLYNN: Okay, Sanford, are you there?
20	Go ahead.
21	MR. TOLLETTE: Oh, yes. I agree. I was
22	trying to wait my time. And, I met James when
23	I first came on the Board. He mentioned me and
24	I didn't know if I wanted to do this or not and
25	had lots of conversations wondering if I would

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fit in. But it was his eyes and his smile. I watched him for years bring the dignity and -or consciousness of humanity in his leadership to our Board and it just raised my heart, my joy, my spirit to be a part of such professionalism in terms of the service of our children.

You know, we've all said something about James but what I would say is a term that was used that he was a lion to help humanity and with a gentle paw and a spirit that he was gently persuasive to get you to walk in a direction for the greater good. And so, with that man, it hit's my heart because I was talking to Ed Appler's son earlier and what a spirit filled day for me right now as we continue this great work on the shoulders of James and Ed. And so that, it's an honor to serve with all of you with me and what I want to say, the path that so many of us before us have lead and especially those pioneers. And so for me, I hope I can lift the spirits of all of us that serve on this commission and that it is truly an honor. And James left on me in a way that I'll never forget. So thank you for

22	bachelor's degree in social work and expects to
23	obtain that by December of this year. So they
24	would like to bring her on board permanently as
25	their Social Service Director.
