Arkansas Infant Toddler Certificate

The Division of Child Care and Early Childhood Education (DCCECE) offers the Infant Toddler Certificate to support practitioners in acquiring skills and knowledge as part of a career pathway in the field of Infant and Toddler Care.

The certificate contains three levels of training: foundation, intermediate, and advanced. Upon completion of all levels, practitioners can expect to build their professional competencies in supporting a young child's social-emotional, cognitive, language, and literacy development. The certificate provides a route to higher education for the preparation of all infant toddler teachers. This certificate will also prepare its recipients to educate children with special needs.
