END OF PUBLIC HEALTH EMERGENCY (PHE) ONCE AGAIN DELAYED.

Division of County Operations Director Mary Franklin (pictured) shared the latest on the eventual unwinding of the ongoing national PHE related to COVID 19. An estimated 400,000 Arkansans have had Medicaid benefits extended during the PHE even though many no longer qualify. Franklin emphasized the importance for all Medicaid recipients to submit renewal packets. "Even before the pandemic...we were mailing those renewal packets out earlier than we did before. We mail those packets out about 90 days before the renewal actually has to be processed. And then we send reminder notices if we haven't received that packet. And some categories are mailed out 120 days ahead." Council member Reba Shipley (top photo) added "I really like how you guys have placed in there that if, say for instance, they no longer qualify for Medicaid or ARHOME you guys are going to help transition them hopefully to the marketplace to where they can at least continue some type of health insurance.

ACCESS ARKANSAS SEEKS TO MAKE PROCESSES QUICKER, EASIER FOR CLIENTS.

Access Arkansas is the DHS website that can be used to apply for benefits, make changes to a case, renew benefits when it is time, upload documents, and receive important notifications. GIVE ME A BREAK: ARKANSAS LIFESPAN RESPITE PROGRAM

In 2020, Arkansas received a 5-year, \$1.3 million dollar grant to help fund respite opportunities for qualifying families. DPSQA Deputy Director Sarah Schmidt informed Council members about the program. "We knew that caregivers in the state did not have out-of-pocket money to pay for respite care on their own. So through our grant we have developed a voucher program.



You can apply for our vouchers. They are \$300 (per quarter) and are paid directly to the caregiver so that you can go out and do what we call 'self-direct' and find your own respite provider." For more information, visit <u>ar.gov/arlifespanrespite</u>.
