

Program of All-Inclusive Care for the Elderly (PACE)

what is PACE?

PACE is a comprehensive health and social services program that provides and coordinates primary, preventative, acute and long-term care services for Arkansans 55 years of age or older who need nursing facility care and live in certain counties. Beneficiaries can receive PACE services in their own homes, inpatient facilities, or PACE centers.

What types of services can beneficiaries receive?

Home & Community

Based Services (HCBS)

PACE covers all Medicaid-covered benefits, all Medicare Parts A, B and D benefits, and any other services or supports that are medically necessary to maintain or improve the health status of PACE program participants. These services may include medical services, home care services, prescription services, and transportation.

How do individuals know if their area is covered by PACE?

Individuals eligible for PACE must live in an area served by a PACE program and be able to live in a community setting without risking their health or safety. PACE is available in the following counties:

what are the eligibility requirements?
